What is SUDC?

Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood (SUDC) is a category of death in children between the ages of 1 and 18 that remains unexplained after a thorough investigation, including a post-mortem. Most often, a seemingly healthy child goes to sleep and never wakes up. At this time, we do not know what causes SUDC, how to predict it or how to prevent it.

The SUDC Foundation

The SUDC Foundation envisions a world where no more children are lost to Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood. The SUDC Foundation is the only organisation worldwide whose purpose is to promote awareness, advocate for research and support those affected by SUDC.

The SUDC Foundation currently supports over 800 families in 18 countries. The Foundation also helps families navigate the difficult and often confusing investigation into their child's death by being a liaison between families and the pathologist or coroner. It also assists families in accessing research which could lead to answers on what may have happened to their child.
